



## What will you do?

- complete an induction to Citizens Advice and training for your role
- explore different ways of fundraising to help Citizens Advice Mid Lincolnshire obtain money, either for specific things, or for ongoing running costs
- help to organise fundraising events to raise money from the local community and encourage volunteers and staff to get involved
- explore other ways of fundraising, including identifying new sources of funding from organisations
- help to build relationships with local organisations or businesses
- help staff put together some information to send to potential funders and to complete applications for funding bids

## What do you need to have?

You don't need any specific qualifications but you'll need to:

- be friendly and approachable
- be non-judgmental and respect views, values and cultures that are different from your own
- have a positive attitude towards fundraising
- have excellent verbal and written communication skills
- have a working knowledge of IT
- have good organisation skills
- be willing to learn about and follow the Citizens Advice aims, principles and policies, including confidentiality and data protection
- be willing to undertake training in your role at both our sites, if required



## How much time do you need to give?

We can be flexible about the time spent and how often you volunteer so come and talk to us.
